

2. SERVICES AND OPENING HOURS

Enrolment and accommodation

The **AF Lyon team** is at your disposal to answer any questions you may have about the school, the courses, the enrolment or pre-registration procedure. They will also help you with any questions you may have about payments or your student card (make sure you have an ID photo with your name on the back).

The team will also answer your questions about the **certificate of assiduity** (issued at the end of your course) or **certificate of enrolment** (to be requested at least 5 days before your last day at AF Lyon).

Finally, AF Lyon offers an accommodation assistance service to help you with the administrative formalities concerning your accommodation. (You must apply **60 days before** the start of your session).

The resource centre

The Alliance Française de Lyon **resource centre** is a study and reading room located on the ground floor, behind reception. It is open every day from 9am to 6pm for all students registered at the Alliance Française de Lyon.

You will find tools to help you consolidate your knowledge of the French language and culture, depending on your level: French language methods, grammar and vocabulary books, dictionaries, documentaries, comic strips, audio books, etc.

Two computers with tabs recorded on Internet sites are available for learning French as a foreign language and for independent work.





There is a **work area** with self-service computers connected to Wi-Fi on the **mezzanine** level (in the hall, above the toilets). If you have your own computer, there is a **free Wi-Fi connection throughout the establishment**.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where to eat in the neighbourhood ?

AFLyon is located in a lively, dynamic neighborhood with plenty of restaurants, cafés and bars serving food from all around the globe

- Along cours de la Liberté, near T1 Liberté stop, you can find the Boulangerie de la Liberté and the traiteur pâtisserie de la liberté. There's also the Le Biniou restaurant (crêpes, salads, takeaway formulas from €4) and the Brasserie de l'Enregistrement (on Bakus).
- Along **rue Paul Bert** (near the AFLyon), there are a dozen of restaurants serving middle eastern delicacies such as kebabs, falafel, tajine, couscous, and so on.
- At place Gabriel Péri Guillotière, there are plenty of famous fast food chains such as McDonald's, Best Bagel, as well as bakeries.
- In **rue Passet** (turn right after the T1 Guillotière stop), you'll find plenty of Asian restaurants and supermarkets.
- You'll also find a number of food trucks : <u>Vanth's yummies</u> - Place Guichard (every tuesday)

1. MOBILE PHONE PROVIDERS

Pour téléphoner, vous pouvez, à votre arrivée, opter pour une carte prépayée (LeBara Mobile ou Lyca Mobile par exemple). Sur le long terme, nous vous conseillons de souscrire à un abonnement auprès d'un opérateur téléphonique français (SFR, Bouygues Telecom, Free Mobile, Orange, ou le groupe MVNOs). Il est important de bien vous renseigner sur les différents prix et **les conditions d'engagement et de résiliation.**

2. EMBASSIES AND CONSULATES IN FRANCE

Remember to report your presence on French territory in the days following your arrival. Consult the <u>directory of foreign representations in France</u> to find the address.

3. LONG-STAY VISA

If you are citizen of the European Union

The only documents required are a valid identity card or passport. On arrival, you do not need to complete any formalities with the French authorities..

If you are not a citizen of the European Union, check whether you need a visa on the <u>France-Visas</u> website. If you obtain a <u>VLS-TS visa</u> (visa longue durée pour études), you will need to validate it on this official website when you arrive in France. By paying the tax stamp, you will be able to stay in France for the agreed period.More information on the <u>Campus France</u> website.

4. **RESIDENCE PERMITS (TITRES DE SEJOUR)**

If you have a VLS-TS visa and plan to continue your studies in France next year, <u>you must</u> <u>apply</u> for your residence permit no later than 1 month before the expiry date of your visa. A **Students Welcome Desk** is organised in September and October to help you with the administrative formalities. It is located at the University of Lyon (92 rue Pasteur 69007 Lyon) Find out more on Facebook : @studentswelcomedesk

You can also visit the **Préfecture du Rhône website** or go there directly without an **appointment, Monday to Friday, 9am to midday** (we strongly advise you to arrive at least 15 minutes before the doors open, as there are many people there).

<u>Our advice:</u> you will be required to buy tax stamps. You can buy them <u>online</u> or at a tobacconist's (where you buy cigarettes and newspapers).


5. POST OFFICE

In France, the vast majority of administrative procedures are carried out by mail, and therefore by La Poste. To find out more about the services on offer, click <u>here</u>.

The nearest post office to AFLyon is 150 rue Pierre Corneille 69003 Lyon. Click <u>here</u> for practical information about this post office.

This post office also has **an automatic change machine** (we don't make change at reception).

6. ACCOMMODATION

AF Lyon accommodation service

AFLyon offers accommodation assistance with a range of options to suit your needs and your stay in Lyon:

- Room in a host family including breakfast (and dinner)
- Room or studio in a university residence
- Studio in standard or confort aparthotel

Please note that you need to **pay** for this service and it is **exclusively provided while you are enrolled at AFLyon**

In order to benefit from our accommodation service, you need to :

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Be enrolled at AFLyon

To book your accommodation:

- Send us your reservation request **at least 45 days before you move in** (we receive a lot of requests and the number of places is limited).
- Pay the accommodation assistance fee. Your reservation request will only be processed upon receipt of payment for courses and accommodation assistance.
- Students staying in halls of residence or with host families are required to take out **home liability insurance**. This document will be requested on arrival.

UNIVERSITY RESIDENCE ACCOMMODATION : CHECKING OUT (ETAT DES LIEUX)

When you leave your apartment, **make an appointment with the residence about ten days before your departure** for an inventory visit. At the end of this visit, the residence will give you a departure form. Return it to the registration office, signed and stamped.



Accommodation for the first nights?

While you are waiting to move into your permanent accommodation, we recommend that you book a room in a youth hostel or hotel.

7. SANTÉ

In France, the <u>Social security</u> reimburses your **medical expenses** if you are **ill, have an accident or are hospitalised.**

If you are enrolled at AFLyon for more than 80 hours of lessons per month for a period of more than 3 months, you can benefit from free French Social Security health insurance. To benefit, you need to register online (see below) and follow these <u>5 steps</u>!

Please note: international students staying for **less than 3 months** are not covered by French Social Security. If you are in this situation, we advise you to take out health insurance in your country of origin or French insurance that will be valid in France for your entire stay.

What is the student status?

If you are enrolled at AFLyon for more than 80 hours of lessons per month for a period of more than 3 months, you will benefit from **student status**, which entitles you to :

- Take advantage of special student benefits (reduced fares on public transport, cinema, theatre, etc.; access to CROUS cafeterias).
- To benefit from free health insurance (Social Security).

Please note : if you have a VLS-TS, this document authorises you to work part-time (60% of the annual working time, i.e. 964 hours) in France.

How to register for social security ?

- Register at <u>https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/</u> as soon as you receive your registration/education certificate and before you arrive in France..
- You will need to submit a number of supporting documents (see the complete list).
- You must then follow these <u>follow these 5 steps</u> to have access to the French healthcare system.
- There is **no need to take out private insurance** in your home country.



8. BANKING

If you plan to stay in France for a long period, we recommend you to open a French bank account for several reasons:

- Avoid paying charges (especially if the currency of your country is not Euro).
- Own a **payment card** as well as a **checkbook.** This is needed to pay your rent and for other administrative purposes.
- Benefit from housing assistance and reimbursement of medical expenses.

Some banks offer free fees for the first year and/or free home insurance. **BNP Paribas** has a **special offer reserved for AFLyon students** (subject to conditions).

Documents to be provided:

- Proof of residence in France.
- Your student card (or letter of acceptance).
- Your valid passport or identity card.

9. JOBS AND VOLUNTEERING

You can work part-time in France (up to 60% of the legal working time - i.e. a maximum of 964 hours per year) if you are :

- Student visa holder
- Enrolled at AFLyon for **at least 4 months with a minimum of 80 hours of lessons per month.**

1. GETTING AROUND

Public transportation in Lyon is managed by a company named **TCL** (which means **Transports en Commun Lyonnais**). TCL manages 4 metro lines, 2 funicular railways, 5 tram lines and 129 main bus lines



Subscriptions:

Every tram stop and metro station has a **vending machine** for buying tickets and renewing TCL season tickets. You can pay for a bus ticket by texting "bus" to 93069.

If you are staying in Lyon for more than a month, we strongly advise you to take out a **season ticket.** You can order it on the website (Click&Collect) or buy it at a TCL branch (the nearest to AFLyon is 6 place Bellecour and it's usually less crowded than other branches).

From 18 to 27 years old : 25€/month From 26 to 64 years old : 69,40€/month

Vélo'V



To get around town and discover the city, use "Vélo'V". This bike hire system lets you use a bike **24 hours a day, 7 days a week**. Lyon and Villeurbanne have around 350 stations. The annual subscription is **€31** (normal rate) or **€16.50** (for young people aged 14-25). For each journey, the first 30 minutes are free (please note: after that, you have to pay).

Museum Card

The Museums Pass gives you access for one year to the 6 municipal museums (list on the link below), for both the permanent collections and the temporary exhibitions. It also gives access to the Musée des Confluences (\in 6) and the Musée Jean Couty (\in 4) at a reduced rate.



Lyon is ideally located, just 2 hours by train from Paris and **1 hour 40 minutes from the Mediterranean coast and the Alps**. The region offers magnificent **natural landscapes** (high mountains, vineyards and valleys, volcanoes, lavender fields, etc.) and numerous UNESCO World Heritage **sites** (Hospices de Beaune, prehistoric palafit sites around the Alps, Chauvet-Pont-d'Arc cave in the Ardèche, etc.).
